Focus on the Future Development of Dunblane

The inaugural meeting of a special working group being set up to address development issues in Dunblane is due to take place next Wednesday (16 June). The Development Working Group is being set up by the new board of Dunblane Development Trust (DDT). It will be a sub committee of the DDT board and will have delegated decision-making powers.

Over the coming months, the Group will be responding to priorities identified in the 2009 Dunblane Community Plan for the Built Environment, Public Infrastructure, the Local Economy and Tourism. These include addressing issues relating to the revitalisation of the town centre, housing development, car parking, maintenance of the 'public realm', environmental improvements and local public transport.

"This is a most important time for Dunblane. As a community, we must look forwards to the future development of the Town. How can we enhance the local facilities which are seen to be so lacking, revitalise the High Street and ensure that the correct decisions are made in the Local Development Plan. We need interested folk to come along and help the town to develop appropriately" said DDT Board member, Alan Booth.

The inaugural meeting of the Development Working Group will be held on Wednesday 16 June. 2010 at 7.30 in the Braeport Centre. The meeting is open to everyone in Dunblane whether or not they are DDT members.
