CAMBUSBARRO

Change of use from dwelling house to pharmacy at 4 Main Street, for Mr D Mitchell and Mr P Pollack.

CORNTON

Extension to dwelling house at 19 River Wynd, for Mr David Gal-
lan.

DUNBRIANE

A mixed use rural development focusing on the delivery of rural office space comprising four business units, two residential units along with an on-site renewable heating system. Other works include the demolition of the redundant farm sheds, upgrading the existing access, provision of car parking and landscaping at land and buildings to south of Stonehill Farmhouse, Dunblane, for Kippendavie Group Trust.
